

# Welcome to the 2022 Gardening Season at the Living Earth Community Garden!

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

If you are new to the Living Earth Community Garden, please fill out a registration form on this page. We will reach out to you to confirm if a garden plot is available by no later than March 31st. If no plots are available, we will automatically place you on a waitlist. If you submit payment and space is not available, you will be fully refunded.

Being part of the Living Earth Community Garden is more than just having a place to grow food. We consider ourselves a community growing space in many different ways and have programs, workshops, volunteer opportunities and regular events that we encourage you to attend and participate in. If you have never gardened before, have no fear, we have a new gardener training program to help you grow and learn as well.

Below are some things to keep in mind prior to signing up:

### **COVID REGULATIONS**

Due to COVID many of the policies and dates that we have now, may change. Please be ready to adapt as the pandemic evolves. The Garden will officially be opened on Saturday, April 24th for Garden Clean Up, Pot Luck and Seed Swap. More information will be forthcoming.

# REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY

There is no garden experience required to garden at the Living Earth Community Garden! We welcome everyone with any level of gardening experience. Each plot must have a primary gardener (the primary person responsible for the plot) who fills out a garden contract. Anyone who gardens at the community garden including family and friends must fill out a garden liability form before entering the garden. Please note, failure to have forms submitted may result in your being asked to leave the garden or have your plot forfeited.

### **RETURN GARDENERS**

New this year! Please read the following updates for the 2022 Season:

- 1) **Virtual Update Meeting**: Return gardeners do not have to attend in person meet and greet trainings. Instead, we ask that you join a virtual update meeting that will go over new things happening in the Garden. The virtual meeting will take place Tuesday, April 19th at 5:30 PM via Zoom.
- 2) **Garden Clean Up, Pot Luck and Seed Swap-** The Garden Opening and Pot Luck Event will take place on Saturday, April 23rd from 10:30-2:30 PM. In addition to volunteering to get the garden ready for the season, gardeners can also swap seeds. Please note that COVID guidelines will be followed as recommended by the CDC and changes may need to take place if in-person gathering outdoors is still not deemed safe.



3) **Clean Up Fine-** please note that if you garden is not properly cleaned up at the end of the year, we will be charging a \$30 clean up fee.

#### **NEW GARDENERS**

Garden Trainings- In order to have a full understanding of all the guidelines at the Garden, we ask that once you have been informed that there is plot available, you attend a New Gardener Training to select your plot and go over gardening basics.

# **GARDEN GATHERING AND SEED SWAP**

We invite you to join your fellow gardeners to officially open the Barn doors and get the garden ready on Saturday, April 23rd from 10:30-2:30 PM (with a potluck lunch break). We will gather together (rain or shine) to help get the barn cleaned up, the tools ready and the garden plots turned over. This fun day is a great way to meet other gardeners, give back to the community and swap some seeds. Please bring a dish to pass and extra seeds you would like to trade.

### **VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENT**

We ask all gardeners to join a "team" that contributes to the maintenance of the Garden or works to build a strong Garden community. Please sign up for one Volunteer Team for the season. Time commitment varies from team to team. We ask that all gardeners record their volunteer hours on our volunteer record in the Barn.

# Partner Plot Team

Responsible for planting, watering, weeding, and harvesting partner plots and delivering produce to Welcome Inn, Theresa House and other organizations with expressed need. Time commitment: weekly.

# Kids Peace Garden Team

Responsible for helping to plant, water, and weed the Kids Peace Garden. Time commitment: weekly.

#### Barn and Tool Care Team

Responsible for keeping the barn and tools clean. Time commitment: weekly.

# Hospitality and Education Team

Responsible for helping to organize monthly gardener meet and greet potlucks with an education focus and posting tips on pest control and organic gardening methods. Time commitment: monthly.



### Flower Bed Team

Responsible for planting, watering, and weeding flower beds near barn and around bird baths. Time commitment: weekly.

# Gardener Assistance Team

Responsible for helping gardeners in need of assistance to weed or water their plots if they are on vacation or have a medical issue. Time commitment: as needed.

### Path Maintenance Team

Responsible for laying cardboard and wood chips around paths and making sure they are maintained throughout the year. Time commitment: monthly.

### Garden Committee

Responsible for meeting monthly during the Garden Season to discuss garden issues and make important decisions regarding the gardens. Time commitment: monthly.

### **PLOT PAYMENT AND FEES**

Plots are priced on a sliding scale. The first plot is \$30, each additional plot is \$10. We invite gardeners who can afford more to pay more if they are willing. This fee will go toward expenses of the community garden (electricity, water bills, compost, toilet fees, tools, maintenance, and education etc.). The fee includes ONE wheel barrow of compost per plot, water, the use of tools, and access to the barn. Gardeners will be charged \$30 for every plot that is not fully picked up at the end of the season.
